Future of Liverpool Open to Public Vote

Leading cross-disciplinary design teams from across Sydney have submitted cutting-edge visions for the future of the Liverpool Georges River Precinct as part of a public competition held by industry association Consult Australia.

Consult Australia NSW State Manager Matthew Trigg heralds the competition as delivering the vision Western Sydney deserves as a future economic powerhouse for NSW:

‘The competition proposals transform old industrial Liverpool into a vibrant people-centric city that puts the Georges River on the map as a global hub for biomedical research, education and biotech start-ups supported by sought-after liveable, sustainable, local communities.

‘The competition highlights the global potential for Liverpool, securing its potential as the third regional city in New South Wales, and capitalising on its unique position between Sydney’s Kingsford Smith Airport and the second airport at Badgery’s Creek.’

The winner of the Public Vote will be awarded at a gala dinner at Old Government House in Parramatta with guests of honour the Hon Andrew Constance MP, Minister for Transport and Infrastructure and the Mayor of Liverpool, Ned Mannoun.

Highlights from the project proposals include:

- Introduction of world-class East Bank river front entertainment district facing a rehabilitated Georges River
- Integrated light rail connecting the new precinct with Liverpool Station, Westfield and other localities
- Iconic architecture delivering the highest standards of green building, including:
 - A Western Sydney Music Bowl to attract local, national and international musicians and entertainers
 - A Cumberland Plain Cultural Centre bring together a range of local exhibits and as a new permanent home for the NSW Migration Heritage Centre
 - A new sports facilities and grounds to complement the proposed Liverpool Stadium
- Strong emphasis on pedestrian connections and liveability, including shared public ways and pedestrianised laneways off central green boulevards
- Active transport and green bridges allowing a seamless transition across major connectivity barriers such as Newbridge Road
- University precinct focused on medicine, biotechnology and health, integrated with innovation hub for biotech start ups
- Rooftop market gardens and new amenities and improved facilities in Haigh Park

Voting will be open until 6pm on Wednesday 21 October.
